Fr. Kevin's Reflection

Well, this week Jesus continues His gathering of the Church. With the Sermon on the Mount, He gives us the "rules" of the game we call: Christianity. Like Jesus, Who is the New Light of the world. Each of us as baptized Christians / Catholics are called to contradict this world of darkness and put into practice this new Light.

Modern man has little understanding of this "orientation". Judaism and Islam, now as in the past, take it for granted that we should pray toward the central place of revelation, to the God Who has revealed Himself to us, in the manner and in the place in which He revealed Himself. By contrast, in the Western world, an abstract way of thinking, which in a certain way is the fruit of Christian influence, has become dominant. God is spiritual, and God is everywhere: Does that not mean that prayer is not tied to a particular place or direction? Now, we can indeed pray everywhere, and God is accessible to us everywhere. This idea of the universality of God is a consequence of Christian universality, of the Christian's looking up to God above all gods, the God Who embraces the cosmos and is more intimate to us than we are to ourselves. But our knowledge of this universality (catholicism) is the fruit of revelation: God has shown Himself to us. Only for this reason do we know Him; only for this reason can we confidently pray to Him everywhere. And precisely for this reason is it appropriate, now as in the past, that we should express in Christian prayer our turning to the God Who has revealed Himself to us. Just as God assumed a body and entered the time and space of this world, so it is appropriate to prayer—at least to communal liturgical prayer—that our speaking to God should be "incarnational", (that it should be christological turned) through the incarnate Word to the triune God. The cosmic symbol of the rising sun expresses the universality of God above all particular places and yet maintains the concreteness of divine revelation. Our praying to the East (*ad orientem*) is properly inserted into the procession of the nations to God. And, as you have seen me (on great Solemnities) celebrate Mass at the High Altar (instead of the table altar) ... this is a reminder of our "orientation" ALL being directed to God ... and not to ourselves. Next week ... a reflection on the Altar. Something we Americans have lost our connection.

Prayer for a new bishop

Heavenly Father, you sent Jesus to shepherd your people and the Holy Spirit to make your people one. Look with favor upon those who will select our new bishop. Give them your vision and let their judgment be clear. Speak your will to them. We thank you for our past shepherds and the blessings they have been for the people of this diocese. Lord, send your Holy Spirit to anoint our new bishop that he may continue the work of renewal in the Church, and unite our parishes, priests and people in love, truth and wisdom. Give him a true shepherd's heart like that of Jesus, that he may give strength to the weak, heal the brokenhearted, console the lonely, bring back the wandering and be a power against the evil of our day. In the powerful name of Jesus we pray. Amen.
