Fr. Kevin's Reflection

Last week, I ended my reflection on how Americans have lost our understanding and, then, seeing the importance of the Altar (whether it is the table altar or the high altar). I think this is due to the fundamentalist influences of our Protestant churches. When you visit non-Catholic churches ... you should notice the focus being on the seat ... the elevated area where the throne of the Gospel and the lectern are located (called the *bema*).

But what about the altar? (And, in what direction should we pray during the Eucharistic liturgy?) In Byzantine church buildings the structure facing the East was by and large retained. But, in Rome a somewhat different arrangement developed. The bishop's chair was shifted to the center of the sanctuary (*the apse*) and so the altar was moved into the back (*the nave*). Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI points out in his tours of the churches in Rome, this seems to have been the case in the Lateran basilica and in St. Mary Major's well into the ninth century. However, in St. Peter's (during the pontificate of St. Gregory the Great (590-604)) the altar was moved nearer to the bishop's chair (probably for the simple reason that he was supposed to stand as much as possible above the tomb of St. Peter). This was an outward and visible expression of the truth that we celebrate the Sacrifice of the Lord in the communion of saints, a communion spanning all times and ages. The custom of erecting an altar above the tombs of the martyrs probably goes back a long way and is an outcome of the same motivation. Throughout history the martyrs continue Christ's self-oblation; they are like the Church's living altar, made not of stones but of men, who have become members of the Body of Christ and thus express a new kind of honoring: sacrifice is humanity becoming love with Christ. (This week's Second Reading ... come to life.)

Prayer for a new bishop

Heavenly Father, you sent Jesus to shepherd your people and the Holy Spirit to make your people one. Look with favor upon those who will select our new bishop. Give them your vision and let their judgment be clear. Speak your will to them. We thank you for our past shepherds and the blessings they have been for the people of this diocese. Lord, send your Holy Spirit to anoint our new bishop that he may continue the work of renewal in the Church, and unite our parishes, priests and people in love, truth and wisdom. Give him a true shepherd's heart like that of Jesus, that he may give strength to the weak, heal the brokenhearted, console the lonely, bring back the wandering and be a power against the evil of our day. In the powerful name of Jesus we pray. Amen.
