## Fr. Kevin's Reflection

Last week I mentioned the significance of the bishop's seat at the Cathedral. When you hear this week's Gospel, Jesus takes up His office as Teacher. Just as the rabbi did not speak by his own authority, so the bishop expounds the Bible in the name, and by the mandate, of Christ. Thus, from being a written word from the past, it again becomes what it is: God's addressing us here and now. At the end of the Liturgy of the Word, during which the faithful stand around the bishop's seat, everyone walks together with the bishop to the altar, and now the cry resounds: "Turn toward the Lord"! In other words, look toward the east with the bishop, in the sense of the words from the epistle to the Hebrews: "[Look] ... to Jesus the Pioneer and Perfecter of our faith" (cf. Heb 12:2). The Liturgy of the Eucharist is celebrated as we look up to Jesus. It is our looking up to Jesus. So, in early church buildings, the liturgy has two places. First, the Liturgy of the Word takes place at the center of the building. The faithful are grouped around the elevated area where the throne of the Gospel, the seat of the bishop, and the lectern are located (called the *bema*). The Eucharistic celebration proper takes place in the apse, at the altar, which the faithful "stand around". Everyone joins with the celebrant in facing east, toward the Lord Who is to come.

Finally, I must mention one last difference between the synagogue and the earliest church buildings. In Israel only the presence of men was deemed to be necessary for divine worship. (The common priesthood described in Exodus chapter 19 was ascribed to them alone.) Consequently, in the synagogue, women were only allowed into the galleries (or the tribunes). As far as the apostles were concerned (as far as Jesus Himself is concerned) there was no such discrimination in the Church of Christ. Even though the public Liturgy of the Word was not entrusted to women, they were included in the liturgy as a whole in exactly the same way as men. And so now they had a place - although in separation from men - in the sacred space itself, around both the seat (the *bema*) and the altar. But, more about this in the weeks to come as we see Jesus gathering together those who will be leading His Church on earth.

### Bishop Paul Swain

Once again we are experiencing the annual flu season. Some are suggesting that it will be especially severe this year. I have endured a flu shot.

Every year at this time I receive requests to prohibit sharing the sign of peace at Mass. Many health professionals have opined that there is little chance of getting the flu by shaking hands any more than by simply being among a group of people. (some of whom may have or are coming down with the flu).

Those who have the flu or its symptoms are dispensed from the Mass obligation and should stay home both for their health and that of others.

As you know I am not inclined to mandate. I do wish to remind you however that gestures such as shaking hands during the sign of peace are optional. Many find this awkward even outside of the flu season as I did on my journey to the Church.

Please use your discretion as to what is appropriate and acceptable for those you shepherd.

May you stay well.

Note: I will suspend the shaking of hands until Easter, April 21, 2019. -Fr Kevin Doyle
