## Fr. Kevin's Reflection

As we read this week's lessons and scripture, the overall theme is: "a time for renewal". A time to look back and see where we have been ... then look forward and put God back in charge. So ... allow me to pickup where I left off as the year of grace 2018 ended (with the celebration of Christ the King). And, a movement of review (and summary) of what I have reflected on concerning why we do what we do as Catholics when we come to this building (especially on Sundays) for Mass. When you think about it what occurs here doesn't involve just 2019 years of Christian tradition and history ... but .... goes back 3000 years before that.

And, like Ezra in the first reading today, we must finish what we were saying about the different ways in which Christian faith transformed the synagogue. The shrine of the Word remained, even with regard to its position in the church building. However, of necessity, there is a fundamental innovation here. The Torah is replaced by the Gospels, which alone can open up the meaning of the Torah. "Moses", says Christ, "wrote of Me" (cf. Jn 5:46). The shrine of the Word, the "Ark of the Covenant", now becomes the throne of the Gospel. The Gospel does not, of course, abolish the "Scriptures", nor push them to one side, but rather interprets them, so that henceforth and forever they form the Scriptures of Christians, without which the Gospel would have no foundation.

The practice in the synagogue of covering the shrine with a curtain, in order to express the sacredness of the Word, is retained. Quite spontaneously, the new, second holy place, the altar, is surrounded by a curtain (from which, in the Eastern Church, the Iconostasis develops). Those of Hoven can especially see this ... since this curtain is painted on the walls of the sanctuary. The fact that there are two holy places had significance for the celebration of the liturgy. During the Liturgy of the Word, the congregation gathered around the shrine of the Sacred Books (or around the seat associated with it ... which evolved quite spontaneously from the seat of Moses to the bishop's throne). Those who have been to Sioux Falls Cathedral now begin to understand why the chair is where it is and the significance of this seat. More about this in next week's reflection when Jesus, Himself, stands up in front of God and everyone in the synagogue of Nazareth.

### Bishop Paul Swain

Once again we are experiencing the annual flu season. Some are suggesting that it will be especially severe this year. I have endured a flu shot.

Every year at this time I receive requests to prohibit sharing the sign of peace at Mass. Many health professionals have opined that there is little chance of getting the flu by shaking hands any more than by simply being among a group of people. (some of whom may have or are coming down with the flu).

Those who have the flu or its symptoms are dispensed from the Mass obligation and should stay home both for their health and that of others.

As you know I am not inclined to mandate. I do wish to remind you however that gestures such as shaking hands during the sign of peace are optional. Many find this awkward even outside of the flu season as I did on my journey to the Church.

Please use your discretion as to what is appropriate and acceptable for those you shepherd.

May you stay well.
