Fr. Kevin's Reflection

Now that springtime is in the air this is a good time to remember summer will be coming upon us. Of course, the dog days of summer begin the process of changing the winter clothes out with the lighter (more breathable) summer wear. But, before we put everything away...make sure you keep the more appropriate clothes in your closet for church. It is very important to remember what you may be wearing on the beach or on the deck next to the swimming pool is not the appropriate attire for church. As you begin to sort what to store and what to keep, be sure to leave in your closet clothes that are comfortable... but at the same time.... "dressy" in nature. Don't be stuck with tank tops, t-shirts, sandals, flip-flops and shorts as your only option. It is important to be comfortable... but not too comfortable...standing before God. Give honor and respect.

Today is the Octave Day of Easter - Liturgically, The Second Sunday of Easter. The Church has always had its own way of celebrating. Both Easter and Christmas are prime examples of celebration ... "Churchstyle!" Both are such great feasts, overflowing with such joy and celebration that one period of twenty-four hours is not enough time to celebrate. And so, the Church gives us eight days. Each day of the Octave is seen as the very same thing as the "day" itself.

Easter offers an interesting "twist." You'll remember from Scripture that Easter "happened" during the night hours. So, the celebration of Easter is on Holy Saturday at the Easter Vigil. That is the Mass of the Resurrection. Some people mistakenly refer to funeral masses as the Mass of the Resurrection [properly speaking, the name for the funeral Mass is The Mass of Christian Burial]. The celebration of Easter at the Vigil is the most important Mass of the year, it is remembered each Sunday, which the Early Church Fathers called a "little Easter."

Looking at your Catholic calendar, you'll notice that Easter Sunday is followed by Easter Monday, Easter Tuesday, Easter Wednesday, etc. The Octave Days continue until the following Sunday, called The Second Sunday of Easter - or, the second Sunday after Easter. So what happened to the "First" Sunday after Easter? Actually, the First Sunday after Easter is Easter Sunday. Easter "happens" at the Vigil of Holy Saturday, the conclusion of the Easter Triduum of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday. By the time the crowds come on Easter Sunday, we are already into the Octave Days of Easter, Easter Sunday being the first day of the Octave. So what's the point? The beauty of the cycle of feasts and seasons of the Church are steeped in age-old tradition and custom. The Liturgical Year helps us to enter more fully into the mystery of Christ so that our faith and our love for Him may be deepened.

As we celebrate the Second Sunday of Easter, we remember the Divine Mercy the Father gives us in the life-saving death and glorious Resurrection of His Son, Jesus Christ. Let's never take the mercy of God for granted. As we continue on in our celebration of Easter, let the joy of Christ rising from the dead be your hope of future glory, and the promise you need to sustain you in your journey home to Heaven.

Throughout the Lenten Season, and most especially during Holy Week so many people worked so diligently in bringing such solemnity and beauty to our liturgical services. Thanks to all for a great job! Your love and care for the church, the liturgy, the parish, and the Lord shines through in all you do.
