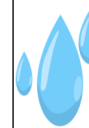

Just a bit from Fr. Schmidt

Minister of the Eucharist

The holy water is back. The sign of peace is back. The Sunday/holyday obligation is back. Almost everything has returned to normal or to its pre-COVID condition and procedure—at least as far as our celebration of Mass goes. One thing that remains different is that I feel no real need to return to the regular use of extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion.

There are two senses of the word *normal*. We often use the word to refer to what is usual, most frequently done or seen in most places. But a more important sense of the word refers to what is most in keeping with the actual *norms*, liturgical laws and guidelines. *Normative* would have more of this sense in actual usage. In either sense of the word *normal*, the Church's vision for the use of extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion is that it actually remain *extraordinary*, that is to say, for exceptional cases that fall *outside the ordinary* circumstances.

Two documents, among others, make this clear. Article 8 of *Ecclesiae de mysterio* lists as one of the practices "to be avoided and eliminated where such have emerged in particular Churches:" "the habitual use of extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion at Mass, thus arbitrarily extending the concept of 'a great number of the faithful.'" *Habitual use* refers to regular, ongoing use, Sunday after Sunday. The document was approved by St. John Paul II in 1997 and signed by the prefects of the various congregations of the Holy See. Again in 2004, paragraph 158 of *Redemptionis Sacramentum* had this to say:

Indeed, the extraordinary minister of Holy Communion may administer Communion only when the Priest and Deacon are lacking, when the Priest is prevented by weakness or advanced age or some other genuine reason, or when the number of faithful coming to Communion is so great that the very celebration of Mass would be unduly prolonged. This, however, is to be understood in such a way that a brief prolongation, considering the circumstances and culture of the place, is not at all a sufficient reason.

Since the use of extraordinary ministers would usually save less than five (certainly less than ten) minutes, I don't consider this at all an unreasonable use of our time for one of the greatest moments of the Mass. That the Church calls for such care—that those normally administering Holy Communion would be men who have spent years in preparation and formation, even receiving the Sacrament of Holy Orders for such a task—should serve as a reminder of how precious and matchless is the great Gift of Christ's very Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, present for us in the Eucharist. Jesus is Himself the High Priest, who gives Himself through sacred ministers as His instruments.
